Dr. Robert F. Avant, professor and chairman of the Department of Family Medicine at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota, has been elected president of the American Board of Family Practice (ABFP) for a 1-year term beginning April 1988.

A member of the ABFP Board of Directors since 1984, Dr. Avant was treasurer before his election as president. He had also previously served as chairman of the Recertification, Credentials, and Examination Committees since being named to the Board.

In addition to his post at the Mayo Clinic, he serves on the Residency Review Committee for Family Practice and is past president of the Association of Departments of Family Medicine.

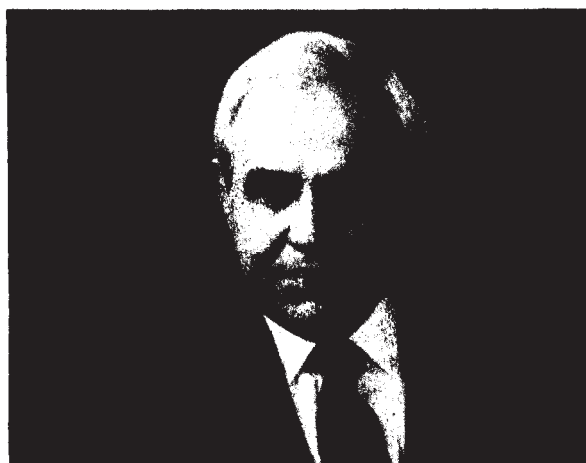
Dr. Avant has served on many intra-Mayo committees, including the Medical School Education, Clinical Practice, and Education Committees. In August 1986, he was named the Sanders Professor of Primary Care at Mayo Medical School.

Dr. Avant, who has published numerous articles and presented scores of medical papers before prestigious groups in the last decade, attended the University of Minnesota Medical School, in Minneapolis, and served in the U.S. Air Force for 2 years following his internship in San Bernardino, California, in 1964.
