The second examination for the Certificate of Added Qualifications in Geriatrics was given on April 20, 1990. Approximately 2560 candidates were examined for the American Board of Internal Medicine and the American Board of Family Practice. At this writing, the examination is being scored and evaluated. Opportunities for examination of nonfellowship-trained candidates will be offered in 1992 and 1994. Subsequently, only fellowship-trained candidates will qualify.

The 1990 certification/recertification examination by the ABFP will be given on Friday, July 13, in 17 sites in the U.S. In September 1990, pre-application materials will be made available for the 1991 examination, which will be given on July 12, 1991.
