Dear Colleagues:

As you may have heard, I recently terminated my role as Editor of the Journal of Family Practice and have accepted the position of Editor of the Journal of the American Board of Family Practice. I feel privileged to become involved with this journal, which was established three years ago on a quarterly basis by the Board in response to the vital need for an expanded forum for the publication of scholarly work in our growing clinical specialty. The Board stands for quality in the certification process and standards of care in our discipline, and has recognized the special importance of the literature of record based on study and experience in family practice settings. This commitment by the Board to this journal provides a stable, long-term base for the kind of literature so necessary to build family medicine as an academic and scientific discipline with strong roots in community practice.

Starting in January 1991, the *Journal* will be increased in frequency to bimonthly and will be further increased to monthly as the need develops. We recognize the continued need for an adequate forum for publication of peer-reviewed work of high quality in the field. We would anticipate that the increased frequency of the *Journal* will make it more accessible and useful to the readership, and provide new opportunities to authors for publication of their work.

The editorial goals and direction of the Journal, charted through the vision and efforts of Drs. Pisacano, Young, Stephens, Brucker, and others, will be continued and built upon. The Journal welcomes a spectrum of contributions including original papers relating to clinical studies, clinical reviews, case reports, editorial commentary, book reviews, and related scholarly articles relevant to family medicine and the family physician. Some additional editorial features are being considered and will be announced later in the Journal.
