

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

As tolerance to barbiturates develops, the amount needed to maintain the same level of infoxication increases: tolerance to a fatal dosage, however, does not increase more than two-fold. As this occurs, the margin between an intoxication dosage and fatal dosage becomes smaller. The lethal dose of a barbiturate is far less af alcohol is also ingested. Major withdrawal symptoms (convulsions and delitium) may occur within 16 hours of last up to 5 days after abrupt cessation of these drugs. Intensity of withdrawal symptoms gradually declines over a period of approximately 15 days. Treatment of barbiturate dependence consists of caulious and gradual withdrawal of the drug. Barbiturate-dependent patents can be withdrawn by using a number of different withdrawal regimens. One method involves initiating treatment at the patient's regular dosage level and gradually decreasing the daily dosage as tolerated by the patient.
